## JUMPER CABLES AVAILABLE FOR EMERGENCIES

From time to time, employees have found themselves unable to start their cars in the garage due to a dead battery and have had to go to great trouble and expense to have a tow truck pull the car to a garage. To assist in cases where the problem is simply a run-down battery, the Support Services Division, TAD-44, has obtained booster cables and will lend them to you in these emergencies.

Obviously, you will need someone with a car with a good battery in addition to the cables. You should also know that damage to the electrical system sometimes results if you reverse the polarity of the batteries of the two cars. Be sure to connect the positive terminals of the two batteries with the same color (red) gripper-handle and the two negative terminals with the other matching-handled (black) lead.
