METRO CONSTRUCTION CAUSES CHANGE IN DOT HEADQUARTERS BUILDING GARAGE TRAFFIC FLOW

METRO's contractor will close two lanes of traffic (nearest the Reporters' Building) on "D" Street between Sixth and Seventh Streets on Monday, November 27, 1972. The remaining "two lane only" traffic condition will probably continue until METRO construction is completed. The present plan is to have one lane of traffic in each direction with bus and through traffic continuing.

It is an appropriate time to reverse the DOT Headquarters Building exit traffic in the afternoon from the present "both lanes out" on "D" Street to "E" Street, and the present "one lane in--one lane out" on "E" Street to "D" Street. This does not appear to present any problem except for timely notification of employees who park in the headquarters building.

Your cooperation is solicited in establishing the following flow pattern:

Traffic from the P-1 level and the ramp closest to "E" Street from the P-2 level, exit to "E" Street in two lanes. All P-1 level traffic exiting to "E" Street should enter the traffic flow south of the ramp leading up from P-2 to P-1.

The ramp from "D" Street will be one lane in and one lane out. Exiting traffic coming up the ramp closest to "D" Street in two lanes should make "U" turns to reach the single lane exit to "D" Street or proceed south on the P-1 level to join the traffic departing via the "E" Street ramp. Signs will be posted in the garage to assist you.

The change will be effective at 4:00 p.m., Monday, November 27, 1972, and will be effective until further notice.
