NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OBSERVED BY DOT FIRE DRILL

Fire drills were held in the three headquarters buildings as part of National Fire Prevention Week observance. All of the drills were highly successful, in large part because of the excellent cooperation of building occupants. Elapsed times from sounding of the alarms to verification of building evacuation by wardens were: DOT Headquarters Building, 12 minutes; Trans Point Building, 10 minutes; and FOB-10A, 7-1/2 minutes. The DOT Headquarters building time bettered previous efforts by 1-1/2 minutes. The Trans Point drill was the first by the recently established interim warden organization, and was a very creditable showing. The FOB-10A drill was at the expected level of excellence.

7th ANNUAL DOT AWARDS CEREMONY

October 15 marked the Seventh Annual DOT Awards Ceremony, honoring forty (40) civilian employees and five (5) military members of the Department for heroism and exceptional competence at duties having direct impact on departmental goals.

This year, the Secretary gave special recognition to the late Lawrence R. Schneider, Chief Counsel of National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) until his death in July, by presenting the Secretary's Award for Outstanding Achievement (Gold Medal) to his widow; and by initiating a new honor award in his name for Attorneys.

DOT EMPLOYEE PARKING

Each administration's safety program is now being reviewed and the first "Award for Most Improved Safety Management Program" will be presented at the annual DOT Safety Management Conference scheduled for November 5-8, 1974, Washington, D.C.
