INFLUENZA IMMUNIZATION

The DOT Civilian Health Clinic is offering free influenza immunization for the civilian employees. Influenza shots will be available in the civilian Health Unit, Room 6227, DOT Head-quarters Building between hours of 10:00 a.m. through 3:30 p.m. Flu shots for the Trans Point Health Unit will be given from 1:00 p.m. through 3:30 p.m. on October 4, 1974. It is most important that each agency adhere to the designated dates and time for the immunizations.

BUILDING MODIFICATIONS TO AID THE HANDICAPPED

As a result of the review earlier this year of provisions in the three DOT buildings to accommodate physically handicapped visitors and employees, and in accord with President Ford's designation of October 6-12 as "National Employ the Handicapped Week," funds have been made available for a survey of the cost to (1) install automatic doors for some of the entrances to all three DOT buildings, (2) replace the inner doors of all rest rooms in the Headquarters building, and (3) adapt at least some of the doors in the Trans Point Building. A work order has already been issued for this survey with a request that it begin immediately.

Where Does the Money Go: A \$9.4 Million Question

Each year after contributions to CFC are totalled, the money ultimately gets divided among local, national and international charities to provide either health, social and/or service assistance.

CFC, as the umbrella for three parent agencies, allots the funds as dictated by the desires of the donor as indicated in their pledge envelope. That way, donors' dollars get the best possible mileage.

One such agency is the United Way of the National Capital Area, a charitable organization that is responsible for soliciting contributions for over 105 smaller agencies. It is the largest volunteer network of human services in the metropolitan area and has services and facilities located in Prince Georges, Montgomery, and Prince William counties; Alexandria, the District of Columbia, Arlington, and Fairfax-Falls Church.

Then there is the National Health Agencies that

is responsible for 11 health agencies in metropolitan Washington. Those agencies conduct research to determine causes, preventions and cures for diseases and disabilities.

And finally, there is the International Service Agencies that help 38 million people overseas with "good ole" American know-how, food, medicine, education, and tools for long-range self-help development programs.

As the parent organizations for over 121 smaller agencies, the three comprise the vanguard for ridding society of its many ills. Considering last year's contributions, here's the way the pie was shared:
