But wait ...... Don't rush off to Personnel just yet. First call to schedule an appointment. You can arrange a time by contacting Marlene Hardester, staffing assistant (x61596), or the staffing clerk for your appropriate area.

To better serve NHTSA personnel, OPM requests that any employee who wants to review his official personnel folder or needs advice on those personnel matters described below, call for an appointment between the

hours of 1:00 and 4:15 p.m. Appointments, in turn, are scheduled for the next day, generally in the mornings. In this way, confidentiality may better be preserved and conferences are free of interruptions from phone calls and unexpected visitors.

Experimental Electric Vehicle

Volunteers Needed To Assist In Study



DOT is seeking approximately 25 volunteers to participate in an evaluation of electric vehicles. The evaluation is concerned with consumer acceptance of electric vehicles and will employ several market research techniques including questionnaires, focused group discussions and conjoint measurement. It is being conducted by DOT Transportation Systems Center under an interagency agreement with the Department of Energy.

Sessions are planned for early May and will take about 3 hours. The special sessions for government employees, including test driving of two or three of the latest electric vehicles, will be held at DOE's offices at 20 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W.

In order to qualify, volunteers must:

1. Possess a valid driver's license (U.S. Government ID not required).

2. Be a member of a household with 2 or more cars, at least one of which is a compact or smaller.

3. Be willing to keep a log of small car use for one week (daily odometer readings and list of trips by purpose).

making, Enforcement, Plans and Programs and the Field.

Marlene Hardester, in addition to providing overall guidance to the staffing clerks, is the official control point for all personnel reports required by NHTSA, OST and the Civil Service Commission. She is also OPM's contact with FHWA payroll, computer services, OST Investigation and Security and their personnel reports section, and the Civil Service Retirement System and health benefits companies.

She provides direct advice and counseling to supervisors and employees on retirement options and computes tentative retirement annuities. Marlene also issues travel authorizations for permanent duty change and the first duty station.

They control and do the final preparation of SF-52's, "Request for Personnel Action" and prepare and distribute SF-50's, "Notification of Personnel Action," Personal Evaluation Reports, Probationary Period Reports and Notices of Expiration of Limited Appointment and code all

personnel data into an automated personnel data bank.

They also do record checks for employment purposes, send out reference checks on prospective employees, process employees entering on duty, verify NHTSA employment, and establish and maintain official personnel folders on NHTSA employees.

In addition, they provide information for internal and external reports and process open season health benefits changes.

All three want to help. But please cooperate and call first. In this way, they can better serve you.
