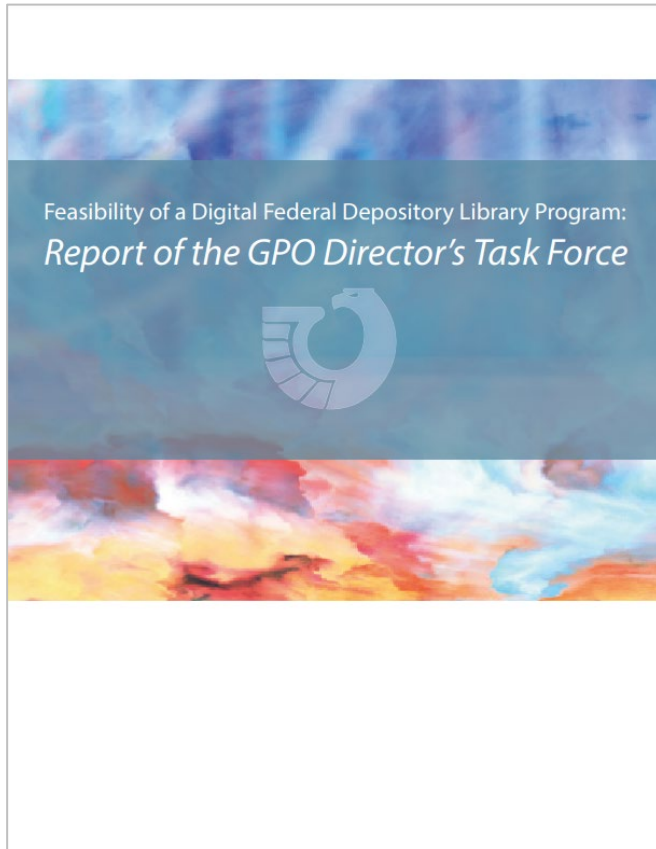


BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FDLP

1813	Congress first authorized the distribution of one copy of the House and Senate Journals and other Congressional documents to certain universities, historical societies, and state libraries, with the Secretary of State responsible for distribution
1860	Government Printing Office established
1869	Superintendent of Public Documents was created in the Interior Department with responsibility for dissemination of public documents as well as the oversight of Congressional printing
1895	Printing Act reformed basic rules for obtaining materials for printing, and expanded GPO's authority over all three branches of Government, and transferred the responsibilities of Superintendent of Documents to GPO
1962	Depository Library Act established regional depository libraries, and expanded the scope of the program to include publications not printed by GPO
1993	GPO Access Act authorized GPO to operate an "electronic storage facility" and locator service
2003	GPO implemented an online public access catalog, the Catalog of U.S. Government Publications
2009	Federal Digital System (FDsys) replaced GPO Access
2018	GovInfo replaced FDsys, and certified as a Trustworthy Digital Repository under ISO 16363:2012

TASK FORCE ON A DIGITAL FDLP



- In December 2022, a Task Force appointed by the GPO Director concluded the FDLP can, and should, move to a digital program.
- Increased focus on digital content:
 - Conducting outreach to Federal agencies.
 - Expanding discovery and access to digital information.
 - Increasing harvesting and preservation of digital information.
 - Growing the GovInfo collection.

Federal agencies are [required by statutory mandate](#) to provide Federal publications to the [Federal Depository Library Program \(FDLP\)](#) and Cataloging & Indexing Program (44 U.S.C. §§ 1710, 1902-1903). Document Discovery and Intent to Publish are two methods to notify GPO of new publications produced by your agency.

GPO's information dissemination programs make agency publications more visible to the general public. Publications are:

- searchable through the [Catalog of U.S. Government Publications](#) and other GPO search tools
- available to 1,100+ library collections across the country
- accessible via persistent link in order to guarantee future access

Guidelines

Publications published through GPO are automatically evaluated for inclusion in GPO's information dissemination programs. All other Federal agency publications published external to GPO, including online, need to be submitted for evaluation. GPO covers the cost of distributing eligible print and electronic publications to libraries [nationwide](#).

All published Federal information dissemination products, regardless of format or medium (e.g., online, print, CD, DVD), which are of public interest or educational value, or produced using Federal funds, are to be provided to depository libraries for public use. Exceptions are those products that are:

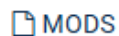

About the Congressionally Mandated Reports

Congressionally mandated reports are defined as those reports that are required by statute to be submitted by Federal agencies to the Senate, the House of Representatives, or to congressional committees or subcommittees. Agencies must now also submit these reports electronically to the U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) after first submitting to Congress, committees, or subcommittees as they do currently.

Not all congressionally mandated reports are required to be submitted to GPO for publication. The congressionally mandated reports in GovInfo are those that are in scope of Public Law 117-263, the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2023, sections 7241-7248, cited as the "Access to Congressionally Mandated Reports Act."
