Crew members of the Coast Guard HH-3F 1496 helicopter engaged in the perilous rescue of a severely burned survivor on 22 December 1977 from atop the explosion ravaged and burning silos of the Continental Grain Elevator Company, Westwego, Louisiana. Despite billowing black smoke, flames shooting into the air, and the threat of further explosions, the severely burned and trapped survivor was successfully rescued from between the two burning silos 150 feet above the ground.

Members of the crew of Coast Guard HH-3F 1484 helicopter engaged initially in the medical evacuation of a severely burned man and subsequently in the perilous rescue of a second severely burned survivor on 22 December 1977 from atop the explosion ravaged and burning silos of the Continental Grain Elevator Company, Westwego, Louisiana. Despite billowing black smoke, flames shooting into the air, and another explosion, the severely burned and trapped survivor was successfully rescued from the burning silos.

SN Berry, while serving as coxswain of CG-MLV-44363 rescued the owner of the sinking F/V ZUMOSA near Destruction Island, Washington, and saved F/V SUMMER PLACE from going on the rocks near Carroll Island, Washington, within a 28 hour period from 31 October 1977 to 2 November 1977. These actions were accomplished despite darkness, seas in excess of 25-feet, winds gusting to 70-knots, and the failure of all navigation equipment on MLV 44363 except the magnetic compass. In these endeavors, the owner of ZUMOSA was rescued from the stormy seas; and the tow was maintained on SUMMER PLACE until a 52-foot CG MLB arrived on scene to tow SUMMER PLACE to safety.

Chief Petty Officer Marshall and Petty Officer Dolloff donned OBA's and entered the fire and smoke-filled room. Using sense of touch and memory, they located the switch and energized the fire pump. The fire was then put out.
